Made in Taiwan is a family comedy that pits a young daughter against her mother. A woman who resorts to any action (including pimping her daughter out for fresh fish) in the name of education. The mother, pragmatic, foul-mouthed and world-weary, is determined to uncover the identity of her husband's mistress. The daughter, a young innocent, makes the mistake of announcing that Dad's mistress doesn't exist. Tragedy ensues in this David and Goliath story set in suburbia.

Made in Taiwan has developed under the artful eye of Larry Moss (off-Broadway's Syringa Tree). Director Andy Belser and Krusiec have workshopped the comedy in Los Angeles and at various festivals, including the first Annual Asian American Theater Festival. Both Variety and the Hollywood Reporter hailed this solo show as festival favorites when it premiered at the HBO Aspen/U.S. Comedy Arts Festival.

"Playing at the NY Fringe is like ultimate speed dating," says Krusiec "You get five chances to perform something that's been incubating for a long time and you hope they leave wanting more. I've had a nice career in TV and film, but nothing beats the rush of performing in front of a live audience ...especially an audience of New York theatergoers. It's exhilarating!"

Renowned acting coach and director Larry Moss calls *Made in Taiwan* "a sincere exploration of growing up in a particular family at a particular time in history. You feel the authenticity of the author and the pain and humor of being an outsider, both in society and in your own home. A wonderful actress and a wonderful story. "



MICHELLE KRUSIEC (Performer/Playwright) first found national and international critical acclaim in her starring role opposite Joan Chen in the romantic comedy Saving Face, directed by Alice Wu. Her award winning performance as an awkward, closeted lesbian garnered her a Best Actress nomination in the 2005 Golden Horse Ceremony, Asia's equivalent to the Academy Award. Currently, Krusiec is featured as Emily on the ABC Family comedy series "The Secret Life of The American Teenager." Other notable feature and TV credits include Far North opposite Michelle Yeoh, What Happens in Vegas opposite Cameron Diaz, her own TV series "One World" (NBC) as well as other ensemble shows such as "Mind of the Married Man" (HBO) and "Dirty Sexy Money" (ABC). A long time student of acclaimed acting teacher Larry Moss, Michelle has trained at Virginia Tech University and Oxford. After Krusiec accosted Oliver Stone on stage while lecturing at Virginia Tech, the director cast her in her first feature film, Nixon. Her critically acclaimed solo show, Made in Taiwan, premiered at the Aspen Comedy festival in 2002 and was later workshopped at the 2007 first annual Asian American Theater Festival in NY. Michelle's next project is starring opposite Juliet Binoche in Relative Insanity, a contemporary film adaptation of Chekhov's The Seagull, directed by Larry Moss.
